

TRICARE VISION BENEFITS

TRICARE PRIME

Active Duty:

Patients are eligible for one ROUTINE eye exam every 12 months.

Tricare does not cover glasses, contacts, or contact lens services.

Any services for MEDICAL eye care (treatment for eye infections, trauma, eye disease, etc.) require a referral from your primary care physician. The authorization must be obtained by you BEFORE services are rendered.

Retired:

Patients are eligible for one ROUTINE eye exam every 24 months.

Tricare does not cover glasses, contacts, or contact lens services.

Any services for MEDICAL eye care (treatment for eye infections, trauma, eye disease, etc.) are subject to a copayment and require a referral from your primary care physician. The authorization must be obtained by you BEFORE services are rendered.

TRICARE STANDARD

Active Duty:

Patients are eligible for one ROUTINE eye exam every 12 months. Cost shares and deductibles do apply. Tricare does not cover glasses, contacts, or contact lens services.

An authorization is not necessary for MEDICAL related services, however, cost shares and deductibles do apply.

Retired:

There is NO ROUTINE vision care coverage for patients with Tricare Standard Retired.

An authorization is not necessary for MEDICAL related services, however, cost shares and deductibles do apply.
